RYDER CUP



New to the tournament schedule this year is our version of the Ryder Cup. And just like the real Ryder Cup you must earn your way onto the team. You do that by playing in our member tournaments throughout the year and accumulating points.

The points are determined by the position that you finish in the tournament. 10 points for 1st place, 9 for 2nd place and so on down to 1 point for 10th place. If a tournament has multiple flights, each flight gets points for 1st, 2nd, and so on.

We also have some tournaments that are designated as Majors. These events are worth double the points. So you will get 20 points for 1st, 18 for 2nd, and so on.

The ladies are also included in all of this. And for tournaments that they can't play in like the Men's Member/ Member, we counter it with the Ladies Member/Member. So everyone has an equal opportunity to qualify.

The top 32 players on the list, 16 on each team, will qualify to play in the Ryder on September 22nd and 23rd. If someone cannot play we take whomever is #33 on the list. And on down until we have 32 players. We will select 2 team captains in the next couple of weeks. The format will be different for both days.

This event won't cost the qualifiers anything. Cart fees, food and drinks will all be taken care of. This event is a THANK YOU to those that participated and did fairly well in the member events that were held throughout the year.

The points list is on a spreadsheet in the pro shop as well as one the website under tournament results. It will be updated after each event.

Enjoying the game—Player eligibility for Gold Tees. Rule of 80—Starting June 1st. Seniors age 65 and older may play from the Gold Tees if they choose. Members whose age plus handicap is greater than or equals 80 will also be eligible to play from the Gold Tees if they so choose. Handicaps will be adjusted according to USGA recommendation.


2018 WCC Tennis Season Underway!!



Waynesboro Country Club Memories

Yvonne MacBride

After graduating from Waynesboro High School in 1943, Yvonne Holthaus started working as a secretary at Letterkenny in Chambersburg. On April 29, 1944, a handsome young recruit from Minnesota came in the office and asked if she had a pencil and paper. When she said 'Yes,' he asked her to write down her phone number. One year later, April 29, 1945, that same recruit, Tom MacBride, and Yvonne were married. Twelve months later, the due date for their first child was April 29, 1946, but daughter Pat waited an extra week to be born. In the days and months that followed, Tom went to Dickinson School of Law on the GI Bill and became a lawyer while Yvonne honed her artistic skills at the Moore School of Design in Philadelphia. Daughter Lynn was born in 1948, and the family returned to Waynesboro in 1950 joining the Waynesboro County Club in 1951. Daughter number three, Teri, joined the clan six years later in 1957.

Yvonne recalls:

When we settled in at Waynesboro, Tom was busy at his law practice while I was home with the girls, Pat age five and Lynn, age three. We joined the club because of the swimming pool. In the summers, the girls and I spent every possible afternoon there. For the first few years, deep sand covered the area surrounding the water. We mothers certainly were relieved when they planted grass instead. No more sand to drag home in every crack and crevice.

While the kids kept themselves busy playing in the water and spending the nickel they each got on candy or a popsicle from the little shop just around the curve up Country Club Road, eight of we mothers sharpened our card skills with multiple hands of bridge – Sarah Zimmerman, Ginny Graham, Helen Shull, Betty Jane Thompson, Alberta Barkley, Mary Jane Weagly, Madge McConnell and me. We christened ourselves the "Pool Club" and the label stuck. Even in the off months of fall and winter when we played in each other's homes, we were still the "Pool Club."

Every summer holiday – Memorial Day, Fourth of July and Labor Day – we all had a huge family cookout at the picnic grounds between the pool and hole number seven (now number 10). After eating, the fairway became a baseball field with paper plates for bases. We'd have to hustle to gather them up every time some golfers showed up on the tee. I remember Dean and Shirley Grove sometimes pushing a baby stroller around with them when they played in the evenings after their work.

Right after the pool closed on Labor Day, the club hosted the annual horse show. Everyone had a great time, riders and non-riders. The girls loved going because everyone was there to join in the day-long festivities, a really great way to end the summer. Being early September, the weather was always unpredictable. One year lots of youngsters were their swimsuits because of the intense heat, and then the very next year, they were their snowsuits to keep warm.

Tom soon took up golf on weekends with Tom Thompson, Glen Snurr, George Buckey, Gene Fogt and others. They were often joined by a larger group of friends who shared a love of the Colts and disappeared to Baltimore for the home games on Sundays, leaving at 9 and taking the long road home arriving around midnight.

Not to be outdone, Betty Jane Thompson and I found the links, too. We always walked so we could take credit for the exercise along with the fun. Her husband often joked that he might as well sell the refrigerator and stove because she rarely got home in time to cook. I played a lot with Marion Smith and Hilde Stevenson, too. Martha Fisher, our ladies' golf chairman, ran a tight ship. During her tenure we finally gained some additional play time on the course that was once limited to Ladies' Day Tuesdays and after 4:00 on weekends. My foursome was one of the first to enjoy the expanded privileges. Betty Jane, Hilde, Ellen Reid and I claimed a start time every Saturday at 10 am. Amy Fry filled in years later after Hilde moved to Hagerstown.

Like other early members of the club, I remember the old club house quite fondly. It looked and felt like home, but I knew it had seen its better days when the time came to build a new one to replace it. I think I miss the big horseshoe bar and outside porch the most. That was the era of big parties, and not just for holidays. Different members were hosting them all the time, sometimes as many as three in the same night. People just don't do that anymore.

We did take one fabulous vacation while Tom was still busy attending various board meetings. I convinced him to take nine weeks off in 1978 to make a trip around the world that I spent endless hours planning. We traveled from Washington, DC to Paris to Egypt to India to Nepal to Kuala Lampur to Indonesia to Thailand to Australia visiting with acquaintances and seeking out locations with a real taste of the local culture. A highlight was Chitwan National Park in Nepal. Chris Kofod, a country club friend who came to town with Frick Company, told us about this magical place where elephants met us at the plane. We slept in tents, saw Bengal tigers and rode in dugout canoes with wonderful guides.

George and Marion Smith introduced us to Hilton Head, South Carolina in 1980, and we immediately loved it. A few years later we bought our own place down there that became our winter home. Tom worked various places and served on multiple boards after leaving the law practice, so a final retirement was a longtime coming.

In the late 1990s, we made Hilton Head our main residence and said goodbye to the Waynesboro Country Club, but I'll never forget some of my best memories that happened there.
