
Dear WCC Members,

As we celebrate our 90th Anniversary, I have an important announcement. The WCC has weathered a significant fiscal storm over the past several years. As a result of declining membership (except for this year), increasing expenses and a huge shift of industry out of the Waynesboro area, the Club has not seen a profit during that storm. During these nonprofitable years, there has been a significant amount of deferred maintenance, a lack of equipment replacement and virtually no remodeling projects besides what our wonderful Volunteer Committee has completed. Unlike most other Country Clubs that find themselves in a similar situation, WCC has not assessed the Membership during the decline and I do not anticipate any assessments looking forward. The good news is that we are on target for a healthy profit this year with increased outside revenues, a 30% increase in Membership usage and aggressive labor/cost slashing to start the year.

Back to the request...I think everyone can agree how nice it is to update/remodel our Clubhouse. The Private Dining Room, Bridal Suite (Card Room), and both Men's & Women's bathrooms look and feel terrific. The Ballroom is the next target and I am afraid the scope of this project is too large for our Volunteer Committee. It needs a new ceiling, new flooring, new blinds, new paint, new closets in the hallway and new lighting. As we are still getting estimates in, I think a good goal to get us started is \$90,000. We have already had a very generous Member offer to get our 90th Anniversary Capital Campaign for the Ballroom started with \$25,000. That leaves only \$65,000 to make our goal. If all our Golf & Social Memberships (who own this Club) contribute just \$200 per membership, we will easily obtain our goal. We had one Member write us a check for \$50,000 and another for \$30,000 this year to help pay last years debtors and our broken air conditioning units respectively. Back in 2014, the Membership came together to replace a quarter of a million dollar 17th Green that was washed out along with several other capital improvements. I know we can do this...Please dig deep, a \$200 donation is great, but it is the \$1,000 level donations that will put us over the top and possibly allow us to start remodeling the Lounge and Bar.

Waynesboro Country Club Memories



Steve Beck

Growing up the second of five brothers, the Waynesboro Country Club has been a part of Steve Beck's life as long as he can remember. His grandfather, Lester Beck was a charter member, and both his father, Ed, and mother, Dot, enjoyed playing golf once the boys got older. With the high school and college sports that took up much of his time behind him. Steve began playing more and more golf as part of both his business dealings and his own enjoyment. He eventually shouldered the chairman's position on the long range planning committee in the turbulent lead-up to the building of the new clubhouse and served two terms as president of the board.

Steve recalls:

My earliest memories of the club were more about the pool than the golf course. I guess I was around 12 years old (about 1962) when I started hanging out with Tom Thompson, Mike Shockey and other friends at the old pool down by the highway bridge – playing cards with Donna Stevenson, Cathy Currey and others, and getting in trouble with Keith Hess, the life guard, for running or splashing or whatever. Then we'd go over to the picnic grounds beside the creek next to what was then #7 (now #10) fairway to catch crayfish and maybe wander up to the stable and hang out with the horses and Peg, the stable hand who lived by himself above the barn. I don't know his given name, but his wooden leg earned him his nickname and he was a nice guy, always willing to just hang out with us.

Sunday dinner was often a well-attended family affair in the crowded back dining room at the club. I'm sure the parents appreciated being able to let their kids run around outside, maybe at the putting green or by the creek, after they had eaten. Then the adults could hang out on the big semi-circular patio added to the back of the old clubhouse long with a new lounge in 1958 and watch the sunset over the course before heading home.

Sue Dill was house manager at the time. Her husband Jack had been hired in 1966 for the position, but died just three months after they arrived. She took over the position and did an outstanding job for over 22 years. She and her children, Patrick, Tim, and Kathy lived in an apartment on the second floor of the old club house. The kids were often part of our gang, especially Sundays.

Baseball, football and basketball kept me pretty busy from grade school through college. Golf rounds were few and far between. But after I came back to town from Morgantown with my business degree from West Virginia University in 1971 to start up the new family business, Beck Manufacturing, I became a Sunday morning regular with our usual foursome – Bill Brake, H.R. Sulanke, and Pat Wolff (usually my partner). We played in the morning, but not very early. Most golfers played late back then.

When I joined the club I was only 21 years old, the youngest member on the roster, I'm pretty sure. Jim Rickett told me that new members served on the golf committee, so I shared the honors with Pat Wolff and Bob Fogle, to name a few. Bob came excited and ready with three new tournament proposals. Member-Guest was already the outstanding favorite at the time, but his new Member-Member caught on quickly, much to the surprise of some veteran members of the committee.

Breakfast tournaments were a very popular feature one or two Sundays a month. The course was closed to other groups for that time slot, so the usual "groups" broke up and everyone played together. It was a great opportunity for members to get to know each other better.

When I first joined the board in 1983, Frank Martin was president. The club was 45 years old and in need of major repairs and updates, so he asked me to begin preliminary long range plan assessments. By the time I became president of the board in 1986, the committee of 28 (including 15 board members and 13 others) had formed, and in May of 1987 we presented our 5-10 year long range plan. Greg Duffey headed the compulsory bridge replacement and pool repairs first. Then everything else took a backseat to the most costly item – replacing or repairing the 59-year-old, deteriorating clubhouse.

Opposition to the replacement was intense because of both cost and sentimentality. However, bringing the old house to codes – fire, asbestos, electrical, handicap access, etc. – was nearly as costly as constructing a new facility and would still let us without necessary the improvements for current and future necessities. I needed no convincing, but when Rich Hoover and I went to the attic of the old clubhouse in search of past records, we had to wade through so much debris and dead bats in addition to the live bats squeaking and wiggling from the rafters over our heads that any lingering doubt in my mind about keeping that structure disappeared. It took a lot of lobbying and convincing, especially with of some longtime members, but eventually, the old club house disappeared, too. By 1991 we had a new clubhouse, a new club manager, Beverly Niederer, and a new golf pro, Rob Bostic. The past would be remembered fondly, but the future was exciting.

Operations were somewhat stable for the next few years. By 2004, 16 years later, when I was elected president for a second term, the nearly "new" clubhouse had already been expanded to include an enlarged lounge and bar area where many members preferred to get together and dine less formally. Improvements to the pro shop, maintenance facilities and course that had been suggested by the original 1980's long range plan had happened, for the most part. Don Harriman was working out well in his third year as club manager, and there were even preliminary plans for building condominiums to the south of the property – echoes of voices more recently.


By the time Jim Fleagle took the helm in 2007, I was ready for a break, but I'm glad I was able to be a part of sustaining the great playground that is the Waynesboro County Club. What a gift to be able to decide at the last minute to play a friendly round of golf on a beautiful course with good people. The Waynesboro Country Club has been and continues to be a big part of my life – a fun place for friends and family.


