

## **Chef Jeff's Recipes**

# Fresh Blueberry Gingerbread with Vanilla Bean Sauce

1 ½ c. Flour ½ cup Brown Sugar

2 tsp. Cinnamon 1 cup Apple Sauce

2 tsp. Ginger 1 tsp. Baking Soda

1 tsp. Salt ½ cup Blueberries

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> tsp. Ground Cloves 1 TBSP Flour

½ cup Softened Butter Vanilla Bean Sauce

½ cup Granulated Sugar

Preheat oven to 350. Grease and lightly flour a 9 x 5 x 3" Loaf Pan and set aside. In a medium bowl, stir 1 ½ cup Flour, Cinnamon, Ginger, Salt and Cloves and set aside.

In a large mixing bowl, using an electric mixer, beat Butter on medium speed for about 30 seconds. Add Granulated Sugar and Brown Sugar, beat until light and fluffy, scraping the bowl occasionally.

In a small bowl, stir together Applesauce and Baking Soda. Add the Applesauce mixture to the Butter mixture and beat until combined. Add the Flour mixture. In a small bowl, toss the Blueberries with 1 TBSP Flour. Gently fold the Blueberries into the batter. Pour the batter into the prepared Loaf Pan and spread evenly.

Bake for 40 - 50 minutes or until a wooden toothpick, inserted near the center, comes out clean. Cool in pan 10 minutes. Remove cake from pan and cool thoroughly on wire rack. Serve with Vanilla Bean Sauce.

Vanilla Bean Sauce ~ In a small saucepan, combine ½ cup Sugar and 2 tsp. Cornstarch. Whisk in ¾ cup of Water until blended. Bring to a boil and continue to boil for 1 minute while stirring constantly. Remove from heat and add 2 TBSP Butter and a ¼ tsp. Vanilla Extract as well as the Vanilla Bean Paste (substitute ½ tsp. Vanilla Extract for the Paste.) Strain and serve warm. Enjoy!

# Message from the President and BOD



Dear WCC Members.

I wish to offer my sincere thanks to everyone for your membership, patronage, and support of your Country Club. You have witnessed a number of facility and golf course improvements over the past several months and hope by now, you realize that this is a trend moving forward as we are more committed than ever to making strides in member services. Many areas of the Clubhouse have been cleaned and organized; in addition, all of the windows have been washed, inside and out. The landscaping is now part of the daily maintenance program and the

results have created a more pleasing view of our beautiful Clubhouse and surroundings for our members and their guests. The golf course has seen significant changes over recent weeks and I can assure you that this is just the beginning of what will continue into next spring and beyond. Your feedback and recommendations are extremely important, so please continue to share your comments.

As the Number One Tee Box Project is being completed by the kind sponsorship of one of our WCC Families, there have been other Members who have asked if the BOD had a "short list" for priority projects. With Steve's assistance and recommendations, your BOD has identified several areas that could be considered deferred maintenance items and will need additional financial support from the membership:

- Clubhouse: Kitchen Equipment Upgrades, Walk-in Cooler, Ladies Locker Room Carpet, Laundry Room Exhaust Fan, Building Painting
- Pool: Chlorination Equipment Upgrade, Pool Furniture, Painting, Pool Surface Repairs
- Golf Course: Irrigation Sprinkler Head Replacement, Irrigation Pump House Repairs, Dead Tree Removal, Bridge Repairs, Bunker Repairs
- Pro Shop: Building Painting
- Horse Barn: Painting and Repair Work

Your BOD and Managers continue to pinpoint ways to measure our productivity in order to achieve a more efficient operation in all aspects of our club. One example is the recent purchase of "surplus inventory" golf course chemicals for a fraction of the cost of the retail value. The product is very usable for our golf course maintenance program and at a savings of nearly \$100,000 for the 2020 Season. The chemical savings will help to offset the cost of leasing golf course equipment to replace some of our aging fleet.

The Clubhouse Operation is also experiencing the challenges of functioning with an efficient and lean staff. We need to continue to encourage our membership to make dinner reservations in order for our managers to plan for their staffing needs. In addition, we will continue to implement the host or hostess program to better inform our members who walk-in without reservations to expect a delay in their seating if we are in a situation that would affect their service. All restaurants, regardless of their rating, will seat their patrons in an organized staggered manner in order to provide the best service, even if there are open tables in the dining room. The WCC Clubhouse has always promoted open seating in the lounge however we might need to consider revising this policy during busy weekends and other high-volume events.

It is a very good thing to have a busy Clubhouse and our Membership, Managers and Staff are willing to make adjustments in order for the members to receive excellent service and to enjoy the wonderful atmosphere at the WCC. Thank you for your patronage and have a nice Thanksgiving Season.
