Waynesboro Country Club Memories

John Fisher

John Fisher, in his words, "grew up at the Waynesboro Country Club." His parents, Jack and Martha, moved to the Waynesboro Area in 1947 when Jack, a golf enthusiast, went to work as a metallurgist for Landis Tool Company. They joined the country club in 1948.

John was only three years old, so his earliest memories began at the "old pool" located near the road bridge entrance. He recalls the two footbridges – one to the parking area and the other to the picnic area adjacent to hole number ten (then number six). Lifeguard was Keith Hess and David Grove swam laps nearly every day he was able. Bobby King often performed his fancy diving board trick while John watched with his friends Billy and Barbara Barkley and David Price.

As he got older, John progressed to the putting green and the driving range that was between holes number one and nine prior to the course expansion to 18 holes. He became part of the Saturday and Sunday gathering of 15 to 20 teenaged boys anxious to earn \$2 a bag (\$2.50 with the usual tip) caddying. Paul McKenzie, the pro, offered free group lessons for the youth.

Paul Shull was principal at Waynesboro Senior High School. As a former Waynesboro Country Club champion, he started the local high school golf team and was very supportive. The school has had two high school state champions – Ted McKenzie in 1957 and Kevin Reiber in 2003. I was a part of the undefeated 1964 team including Joe Shull, Tommy Eyler, Skip Rowe, Steve McConnell, Alan Sheeley and David McKenzie.

The pro shop was much smaller with club storage and merchandise sales at opposite ends from the present ones. The maintenance building was also smaller as there weren't any golf carts to store. Bill Shull purchased the first one so he could continue to play despite the weakness in his legs that lingered after his bout with polio. Dick Kline was greens keeper, but his equipment consisted of merely a small tractor and two gang reel mowers.

The clubhouse, a converted farmhouse, had family quarters for manager Sue Dill and her family on the second floor, dining room and ballroom on the main floor and the men's locker room and bar room in the basement with a card table, pool table and small television to view horse races and other sports. The 1959 revision added a new men's locker room and a large semi-circular bar/lounge manned by Charlie Washington who offered drinks, wisdom, patience and horseracing odds.

The nearby barn, still standing, stabled a goodly number of horses and hosted the annual horseshow that attracted hundreds of spectators. I still remember seeing Angela (Grove) Weagley riding her horse along the edge of the course beside Mentzer Gap Road.

In 1964 and 1965 a severe drought left the fairways brown and rock hard. This spurred the installation of an irrigation system.

In 1970 ten new holes were added – today's number 2 through 8 and 13 through 15 – and hole number 4 was eliminated making Waynesboro Country Club one of the few 18-hole courses in the area. The lake to the right of today's number ten was created over the creek. The transition turned number 11 women's tee into the men's tee and lengthened number 12 by 150 yards. A new green and practice range were constructed. Par remained at 72 for men.

When I was in high school and later Gettysburg College in the 50s and 60s I was consumed by the game often playing seven days a week. Play times were different then than they are today. Most tee times were in the afternoon with better ball foursome matches as many men worked Saturday mornings. The typical work week at the shops was 50 hours, nine hours Monday through Friday and five hours Saturday morning. All tournaments were held on Saturday. Sunday mornings were reserved for church activities and such and the more acceptable play time in general was the afternoon. The main exception to this were the doctors (Barkley, Brown, Shockey and Snurr) and small store owners who traditionally closed their doors and headed for the golf course every Thursday afternoon to compensate for lost hours on the weekend.

The men's club championship consisted of 36 hole match play with no carts and was always played on Labor Day. I watched dozens of them and played in four winning in 1970 and 1976.

I can't speak for the women golfers, but I have a host of men's faces in my head who were outstanding golfers in the 50s and 60s including the top scorers Tom King, Elden Joiner and Cub Hess and the longest driver, the witty, temperamental Preston Flohr. The host of others include Watson Craig, Jack Grundy, Jefford Oller, Fred Henicle, Charley Rinehart, Max Sheeley, Harper Miller, Ed Creager, Bub McCleaf, Charley Scott, Jack Bricker, Bink Bonebrake, Bud and Dr. Jim Kauffman, Ken and Gordon Weagley, Ed Beck, Glenn Fry, Raymond Yingling, Bob Starry, Jamie McBean, Dude Martz, Jack Fisher, Watson Fisher and Bud Fisher (not related). Steve Rollins played and coached the1964 high school team and Harold Brake actually won the Gettysburg Country Club championship, but not Waynesboro despite the numerous times he played the course.

By 1977 I had married and started teaching in Bermudian Springs high School. With the three children that followed and the three sports I coached, I had no time for golf at my favorite course – or any course for that matter. I dropped my membership at Waynesboro Country Club not to return until time and retirement finally allowed in 2014. I play now as much as I can, usually with the white tee men's group, about three days a week. The memories are everywhere.
